Notice is hereby given that the Cuba State Bank did, on the 15th day of December 1892, close its doors, and the officers of said bank thereafter and from that time, and do now, refuse to pay the creditors of such bank in whole or in part. That on or about the 20th day of December, 1892, Charles F. Johnson, Bank Commissioner in and for the State of Kansas, took and assumed full charge and control of such bank, and the said bank commissioner remained in the full possession and control of the same until the 6th day of January, 1893, when the same was turned over by said Commissioner to Chauncey Perry, Receiver as hereinafter mentioned and set forth.
